Pupil Premium Grant was introduced by Government in 2011. It's allocation is linked to the number of students registered for free school meals in the last 6 years, to those who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months and to children of service personnel.

The purpose of the grant is to raise attainment among disadvantaged students through the provision of learning opportunities.

For reading 25% of disadvantaged children have moved from emerging to the expected standard, 7% have moved in maths and 50% of PP children have moved to expected in SPAG.</p>
