Pupil Premium & Free School Meals

After the forms were checked by County I am delighted to tell you that we have increased our Pupil Premium numbers by seven which will allow us to support these and all children further. This week we have received additional information regarding entitlement to Pupil Premium and Free School Meals.

Previously not know what that families in receipt of Universal Credit can also qualify for Free school Meals, but this is being changed by Government at the end of this month there I urge parents to please make contact if they are in receipt of any amount of Universal Credit, even if you only receive a very small amount you will qualify for Pupil Premium and therefore FSM. The application needs to be submitted by the end of April and just needs evidence of UC to be supplied, no financial information is needed. Please pop into the office with this evidence and your national insurance number.

- **Universal Credit (regardless of income amount, as a temporary measure during the early stages of rollout).**
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Income Support
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Striving to do the best for all our children, I would also like to invite all Pupil Premium families in to talk to me about strategies and ways of supporting their children achieve their potential. Please let me know if you are keen to join this informal chat.

Uniform and Kit

I write to remind parents about the schools expectations for children's uniform: Children are expected to maintain a smart standard of dress and **MUST** arrive at school wearing their sweatshirts or cardigans. School uniform is as follows:

What is allowed:

Black/grey trousers/shorts, white shirt/blouse, bottle green jumper/cardigan/sweatshirt, grey pinafore/skirt, green and white gingham summer dress, white, grey or black socks (girls may wear white socks), black school shoes. Shoes should be flat, robust and safe and shoes should not have any decorative material on them.

Parents are asked to maintain standards by providing children with school clothing in the spirit of these guidelines. Please ensure all items are named.

What is not allowed:

Jeans, cords, ski-pants, tracksuit trousers, trousers with large fashion zips, sports trainers, sports shorts & trainer socks.

Sports Kit

Black shorts, a plain white 'T' shirt, PE shoes daps/trainers will be required for PE lessons. We are seeing external team kits and bright clothing increasingly being worn during the school day. These are only acceptable for clubs after school not during PE lessons, sports activity afternoons or fixtures. From September we will expect dark coloured jogging bottoms. Team kit will be provided if your child represents the school at fixtures.

Jewellery/Hair

It is school policy that jewellery including friendship bands etc. should not be worn. (Medical alert chains are permitted). Necklaces and earrings are particularly dangerous in games and playground activities. Children with pierced ears may wear studs, but not earrings. Watches are permitted, at the owners risk, but chimes and alarms should be turned off! Hair should be natural colours during term time and long hair should be tied up whilst at school, as it can be dangerous during PE. A reminder that girls may wear green summer dresses (and boys shorts) if the weather is warm enough.

Lost Property

We have accumulated a very large amount of lost property including some very good coats, snack pots, jumpers etc. We will be putting these out in one of the shelters after school next Thursday – please come and claim anything lost. Any items not collected on Thursday will be put back out again on Friday for anyone else to take if wished. Everything will be disposed of after Friday.

Y3 Visit

On Wednesday 18th April Y3 will be visiting Seaton Jurassic and Beer Quarry Caves. This will take place within the school day, so your child needs to arrive and be collected at school at the usual times. The focus of the trip is Geography, consisting of explorations of the caves and Seaton Jurassic with a workshop at the centre. Therefore, appropriate warm layers of clothing will be needed for the quarry caves which are cool all year round and footwear such as trainers or walking boots will be required. Please bring a small rucksack with waterproof coat, water bottle and a packed lunch. If your child has an inhaler, please ensure that they take it with them, and if they suffer from any allergies or travel sickness please do let us know. Parents have been requested to make payment and give consent via parentpay or at a shop displaying the paypoint sign by Tuesday 10th April. We still have a few permissions outstanding.

Y1 Visit

On Wednesday 18th April Class 1 are visiting Axe Valley Animal Park, in Axminster, Devon. As we will leave school at 9.15 am, please could your child arrive in school promptly, to give us time to organise the children and leave on time. We will be back in school by 3.30 pm. This visit will build on the learning the children have been experiencing at school and give your child first hand opportunity to explore, enhance and reinforce learning about animals in their different habitats. Your child will need to take a packed lunch in a shoulder bag or rucksack and a soft drink in a plastic drinks bottle and will need to wear school uniform with trainers/old shoes and depending on the weather, take a waterproof coat,

sun hat and sun cream. If your child has an inhaler, please ensure that they take it with them, and if they suffer from any allergies or travel sickness please do let us know. The trip will be appropriately supervised by class teachers, teaching assistants. Parents are requested to make payment and give consent as usual via parentpay.
