Dear Parents and Carers

Extended Services

A few parents have contacted me with their concerns about the recent increase in charges at Extended Services. The Governors discussed this on Thursday and have decided to reduce the cost of the second session of Stay & Play (4.30/5.30pm) to £2.50. We hope that this reduction will help parents using the provision and lower their costs. Thank you for your feedback. Please may I also remind parents to pre book places at extended services on parent pay. We need advance notice so that we can ensure we have enough staff available for your child to attend.

Safe Parking

There has been a complaint from a neighbour about parking in Wellings Close. Please can I ask that parents are thoughtful of our neighbours and ensure that you do not block entrances and also allow enough space to allow emergency vehicles to get through. I want the space around the school to be as safe for our children as possible, particularly at the start and end of the day. This means we all have to work together to do this. There is safe parking **over in the Village Playing Fields Car Park and the gates are opened each day at 7:30**. If as many parents as possible could park over there and walk over to school, across the field only a two or three minute walk, we could reduce the congestion further. I appreciate that some mornings we may be running late but if generally we allow ourselves enough time to get to school and park-up, we can all help to make the area around the school as safe as possible for our children.

Community Day

On Saturday 22nd October we will be having a 'community day' at school. We are asking for help with 'odd jobs' on the internal areas of the school.
